
## The Happy Christmas Tree Album Cover ~ by Terry White On The Sixth Day Of Havel's, My True Love Is Snip-Eze Blunt Tips

## Make the Garland

**1.** Trace the design of the garland onto the tree.

When I want to trace a line from a pattern, I trace the lines onto a piece of paper.






I cut away along the line I want. Trace the line, and then cut the next outline and so on.

I use **Havel's Teflon Coated Scissors** to cut out the paper pattern.



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**2.** Use **Havel's Snip-Eze** to cut purple metallic ribbon pieces. Each ribbon section should be cut 4" longer than the design.



**3.** Use the bar-tack on your sewing machine to stitch the garland down. I used a purple rayon thread.

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**4.** Use the closed Snip-Eze to pull up a little ribbon between each bar-tack to make it look loopy.



Use a tapestry needle to secure the ribbons to the back of the work.
